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
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Introduction

She had four legs and, as a result, was billed as the "Four Legged Woman." The startling reason behind her four legs is that she had the lower limbs of her unformed twin growing from her pelvis. These limbs were too weak to stand and her original right leg had a clubbed foot and so only one of

her four legs was of use. She had five children after marrying Dr. Clinton Bicknell at the age of 19.

3) Dede Koswara: Indonesia

This Indonesian was called "tree man". Not at all surprising to be given such a name after a cursory glance at his photo. After cutting his knee as a teenager, a small wart developed on his leg. It spread uncontrollably so most of his body was encased in such peculiar treelike growths. He has undergone nine operations to remove more than 8 kgs of gnarled warts from his body.

This condition is thought to be caused by the Human Papilloma Virus, which usually causes only small warts, but if the patient suffers from a particular immune-system deficiency, then the body is unable to control the warts and allows the virus to spread and produce extreme growths known as "Cutaneous Horns".

4) Arthur Loos: Pate Buns Lau, Poland

This man had huge folds of skin hanging down from his face. He suffered from neurofibromatosis, which causes the wildest possible skin ab-

normalities. He performed at the Ripley's Auditorium in Chicago in 1933.

5) Anita

She was coined as "the only human on earth with a nose like an elephant's trunk". She performed at the Coney Island Sideshow in New York, in 1944. During this time Coney Island was renowned as the world center of the amusement park industry.

6) Liu Ge: Beijing, China

He has a nose that is nearly 10 cm long and 7.5 cm wide. He had been drinking up to 2 liters of brandy a day for 52 years and it has left him with a condition called rhinophyma, caused by the constant expansion of blood vessels in his nose.

7) Santlal Pal: Mumbai, India

He can be called the "Double Header". In February 2018, doctors in Mumbai, India, removed the heaviest recorded brain tumour from 31-year-old Santlal Pal in a marathon seven-hour procedure.

The 1.87 kg tumour was protruding from his scalp, causing swelling, headaches and blindness in both eyes. It also seems as if he has another head growing on top of his actual one. The growth was not only inside the brain but also outside it, between the skull and scalp. He recovered after his operation but his blindness was still left uncured.

8) K. Palanisami: Tamil Nadu, India

He has 5 tumours that weigh a fearsome total of more than 18kgs. The growths first appeared when he was 12 yrs old. He has 2 on each of his arms and one on his neck that affects his speech.

After several tests doctors are mystified by the lumps and hesitate to remove them out of fear that the operation could turn out to be very fatal. He lives with his brother and sister-in-law, who take care of him.

9) Khadija Khatoon: Kolkata, India

The kind of face she possesses would earn her the name "Faceless Woman". She was born with a facial condition that has left her with no discernible eyes. In place of her nose there are just small slits. According to one neurosurgeon she suffers from neurofibromatosis, a genetic disorder that causes tumours to grow throughout her body. The doctors even now believe the possibility of the tumour right inside her face. Her condition has worsened over time.

Her demonic face can traumatise even the most stone-hearted person, at least for a moment or two. In spite of her struggles, she remains optimistic and says she is "happy in this life."

10) Gurmeet Singh: New Delhi, India

His giant tumour really looks spine-chilling. In October, 2015, medical science came across the world's largest tumour in its history.

This tumour began to grow on the thigh of his right leg, and it eventually grew devastatingly dangerous. He was bedridden for almost four years after a biopsy report confirmed the inflammation in his right thigh to be cancerous. Doctors were left with no other option than to amputate his leg to remove the enormous and deadly growth.

The tumour alone weighed 1.5 times Gurmeet's weight. The tumour was a colossal 55kg while Gurmeet was just 37kg.

Samudradatt's plots were carried out with incredible accuracy. No one on earth could have

escaped alive from such skillfully planned plots. In spite of these three murderous attempts, Daamanak was set free only because it was destiny's whole and sole will.

This incident took place years ago and is quite unbelievable. But even this incident will somehow be overshadowed by the brutal happenings that unfold ahead.

Just keep this law in mind, because it will be all one can say after reading these occurrences.

DESTINY WILLS, HE DIES DESTINY CHILLS, HE FLIES

1) Hu Zhuyin: China

He was a mere labourer working at a construction site in Qingdao, China. Yet, one day, an

unforgettable occurrence appeared in his life.

While climbing the scaffoldings, he slipped and fell in such an unbelievable manner that he got himself impaled on a crowbar.

The crowbar vigorously sliced through his chest and made him and the others watching thoroughly convinced about his death. There was no means by which one could even hope to witness him alive the next minute after being a victim of such a brutal accident.

BUT...he survived.

After closer inspection, it was found that the crowbar had narrowly missed his aorta by a mere half-inch (1cm). Had it not, he would have been travelling to his next life. It was one of the luckiest escapes in history. Destiny said 'He has to live.'

2) A Boy: Gothenburg, Sweden

In September, 2014, a six-year-old boy suddenly fell from a 70ft (201m) high apartment balcony. Fatal collision with the ground and death were the only possible consequences, but there came a twist in the tale. Fortunately, a passerby stopped when he saw a boy falling from such a height and saved him by managing to catch him safely.

3) Hamar Singh Rajput: India

He thought he was going to die any moment after being impaled harrowingly through the neck by 2 iron rods.

This 26-year-old Indian lost control over his motorcycle and by misfortune, slammed into the back of a truck carrying construction materials, including 3ft(1m) long iron rods.

The impact of the crash caused the rods to go all the way through his body and out his back. It took the doctors three hours to successfully remove them and amazingly, Hamar never lost consciousness throughout the painful ordeal.

4) Sophie Frost: Rayleigh, United Kingdom

Sophie Frost, a school-going girl was struck by a 30,000-volt surge, but something saved her life. The iPod which she was using at the time of the lightning strike made the current travel through its wires, diverting it from her vital organs.

The thing that turns out to be even more surprising is that this iPod was gifted to her by her grandmother just four days before this incident. The saviour arrived on time.

5) Zhou: Zhuzhou, China

In December 2018, this 29-year-old, was working at a porcelain factory when a piece of machinery malfunctioned and he was struck by a falling robot arm covered in steel spikes.

Each spike measured about 1ft (30cm) in length and 0.6in (1.5cm) in diameter. He was impaled by a total of 10 steel spikes with 6 of them entering his right shoulder, chest and arm, narrowly missing an artery by a baffling 0.04in (0.1cm).

This victim was taken to a local hospital by his co-workers, and then was transferred to Xiang-ya Hospital of Central South University due to the severity of his condition. He amazingly survived his distressful injury. This case was highly complex because it was impossible to even x-ray him before operating.

6) Venkata Ram Prasad: India

On September 14, 2017, this 43-year-old man was stabbed in his neck. After this gruesome attack, he was driven 7 hours to a hospital. Later a CT scan revealed that the meat-knife was embedded 5.9in (15cm) into his neck, reaching his spinal cord.

Surgeons carefully removed the object, which shockingly left Venkata only with paralysis in his left hand. He too survived the blow.

7) Cava Felipe Massaneiro: Recife, Brazil

In 2008, this 18-month-old toddler somehow plunged out of his thrid floor apartment window. The manner in which his life was saved is just indigestible.

Guess what saved him. His 'DIAPER'! Sounds funny, but it is the fact. His diaper snagged on a security spike, slowing his fall, and eventually saving him. Impossible to even dream of a diaper saving one's life.

8) A Construction Worker: Chengdu City, China

This is one of the most incredible incidents that will paint your faces with utter disbelief. It's only possible for destiny to put up such a dramatic drama in the real world.

This worker suffered an electric shock and fell vertically onto a 4-ft long (1.2m) steel bar. Yes! He fell vertically. The bar penetrated into his body

through his buttocks and exited from his right shoulder. Except death, what other hopes would one have but there was a twist awaiting to be revealed. The bar did pierce into his body but luckily dodged all of his vital organs and then exited. It didn't cause any damage to his vital organs, and his life was spared.

9) Kyle Cook: Lakeland, Florida

In 2012, a bolt of lightning knocked him back 6ft (1.8m), rendered him unconscious for a minute, and caused him to have a mild heart-attack. In April 2016, a recluse spider bit his left hand, requiring him to undergo surgery to drain the toxins. In August 2016, a rattlesnake attacked him in his backyard, resulting in another trip to the hospital, though luckily, the venom did not enter his bloodstream. Before those recent misadventures, he had also survived bites from an alligator and a Burmese python. Despite so many fatal happenings, death never knocked at his door.

10) Delarine Saisi: Nairobi, Kenya

Bang!!! A block of a six storied building collapsed. It all shattered down and this seven-month-

old baby got stuck under the rubble. There were only ruins and four days passed, along with the hopes of seeing the baby alive. After 4 days she was pulled out from the ruins and was miraculously found alive.

Conclusion

Daamanak was naturally rescued in all his plots because, in his previous life, he was a fisherman who, on a Jain monk's word, left fishing for the rest of his life.

His wife was completely agitated by his senseless decision, but could not modify his mind even an inch, even after striving thoroughly.

His fellow fishermen too forcibly made him continue fishing, but he used to free all his fish back into the lake. This happened three times, but he remained steadfast, honouring his vow with both dedication and determination.

The people involved in these accidents might have also done something virtuous for which they were spared and not put to death. But at the same time, they definitely had to undergo a lot of agony throughout the ordeal, as a result of their other violent deeds.

The rules for Daamanak were the same as



Alterations

You constantly attempt to drive out karma, but unwaveringly, it presents no signs of departure until its impact has been experienced.

"सकयं नासिज्ज कस्स किर कम्मं"

-Whose self-generated karma would bid him goodbye?

Many such various writings point out this

one single fact- 'Karma is inevitable.' We believe it thoroughly in our hearts and explain this fact to numerous other people with such firm assurance that this concept gets drilled into their minds to the core. Then a long list of innumerable examples is placed in front of them, that not only enhances this bit of information, but fixes it irrevocably in their hearts.

But..

Are we through-and-through, spotless in believing this to be absolutely true???

Are all such punchlines flawless from all angles???

Are we able to accurately touch the faultless essence hidden in these lines while we staunchly hammer this concept into others' brains???

The answer to all these questions is merely one.

A Big 'No'

This concept is obviously not wrong, but it doesn't throw light onto the whole lot of Karma. It throws light only on a particular category of it called the nikachit karma, the unalterable karma.

This concept is true when its subject is nikachit karma, but not all categories of karma are unalterable.

"उदय-खय-खओवसमो-वसमा जं च कम्मुणो भणिया | दव्वं खित्तं कालं भवं च भावं च संपप्प ॥"

- Vishesh Aavashyaka Bhaashya – 575

- Karma's alteration, in the form of uday, kshay, kshayopsham and upsham, is said to take place on the basis of five fundamental instruments.

Dravya - Kshetra - Kaal - Bhav - Bhaav

In order to bring changes in the course of any karma, at least one of the five has to change.

The arrival, departure, or any kind of alterations of any of the five instruments, puts an end to the long-lasting continuity of a karma by deactivating it, or by activating another variant of karma which was inactive, but present in the background.

This process takes place irrespective of the karma's category. It may be a good or a bad karma that restarts or halts. It all depends on what sort of instrument is brought into play.

These instruments might be brought into play intentionally by us, or they may simply arrive on the scene without us deliberately doing so.

But... the fact remains unchanged. The prospective changes by the newcomers will be generated irrespective of one's will.

Let's see how these five instruments have been playing an essential role in the modification of karma all over the world.

Dravya→ Karma↑↓

Dravya means any kind of matter. It includes non-living objects and living things too like humans and animals.

1) Colin Seaman: Norfolk, England

This man, at the age of 20, became a victim of an excruciating migraine. It struck him almost every day. All manners of drugs and injections were attempted in the hopes of successfully knocking his migraines off. He even clipped clothes pins onto his face, but only failure knocked at his door. It went on uninterrupted for a length of 50 years, and none

of his attempts proved impactful, possibly because they might not be the ones who could bring that change.

He was 70, and all his help had severely broken down, when the destined solution arrived. With some purpose, he got his ear pierced. And that was it. The migraine, from that moment, left his head completely vacant. It was that ear-piercing instrument that miraculously ended the 50-year-long pain, though he had not even intended to do so.

2) 900 People: Tumbler Ridge, British Columbia, Canada

These people were gladly surfing the internet, when something dragged their karma into play, which made them lose their internet service. An important fiber cable in several locations, providing them with internet service, had been CHEWED BY BEAVERS. Though it was protected by a 4.5 inchthick (11.4 cm) conduit, the beavers deprived these people of their internet service, by chewing through the fiber cable.

3) Jody Smith: New York City

He suffered from epileptic seizures (sudden

attack of illness, especially in the form of a stroke or fits, which causes loss of consciousness or convulsions). To cure him, doctors removed a part of his brain, including the amygdala, the section responsible for how a person reacts to danger. As a result, he no longer has any feelings of fear. The removal of this part of his brain extracted his fear by deactivating it.

4) Passengers in a Siberian Airline's Flight: Magadan, Russia

On the 17th of August, 2020, this flight was attempting to land at the airport in Mangadan, Russia, but was delayed for 20 minutes. That reason for the delay was a bear on the runway! All the passengers landed 20 minutes later than expected.

This delay could not have come into existence without the triggering of the passengers' karma. The presence of the bear was cause for the trigger.

Kshetra → Karma ↑↓

Kshetra means any kind of place. It may be a city, a house, a garden or any such space.

1) The building of the Five Fishermen restaurant: Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada

This building, currently housing a restaurant, was once a morgue where dead bodies were brought following the sinking of the Titanic in 1912. As a result, the place was struck with ghostly vibrations causing the restaurant to be labeled as haunted.

In fact, it is not just said to be haunted, but because of the place's heart-throbbing eeriness, visitors have witnessed strange voices and cutlery flying off tables in the restaurant. This place induces chilling horror in the insides of the inside-goers.

2) A river in the Amazon rainforest: Mayantuyacu, Peru

Any small animals like frogs that dive into the 6.4 km long and 24 m wide stretch of this river in the Amazon rainforest, instantly fall prey to death.

For less than half a second, a dipped human hand in this river gets third-degree burns.

Yes!!! The river in the water is BOILING, which causes such fatality. But this state of water is thought to be caused by hot springs that are fed

by a geological fault line. So, it's the geographic characteristics of the place causing all of this.

3) Twin Village: Velikaya Kopanya, Ukraine

This village has 122 twins among their population of less than 4000. The true reason for such a high-rate is concealed behind the veil, but the villagers believe it to be the effect of the health-giving properties of the local water. This is even affecting the cattle, with above average births of twin calves.

Regardless of the reason, whether it's the local water or some other factor, this village is unusual and subject to this strange effect.

4) The Valley of Flowers: Himalayas

There lies a place in the vast and enchanting mountain ranges of the Himalayas called 'The Valley of Flowers'. This place has such a weird energy that whosoever brings himself within the premises of this mysterious land forgets all his memories, to the extent that he even forgets his own name. Kaal → Karma ↑↓

Kaal means time. It can be day or night, summer or winter, or any other period of time. All are a part of kaal.

1) Shoaib Ahmed and Abdul Rasheed: Balochistan, Pakistan

These brothers lead very indifferent, active lives by day, but their nights work out in an utterly different fashion. At night, they are left paralyzed to such an extent that they are unable to even open their eyes, move, eat or talk. The locals have dubbed them as "Solar kids", presuming they get energized by the sun. This folk theory was dismissed by doctors after observing that the brothers remain completely fine and active during a cloudy day or when kept in a darkened room during the day.

The rejection of this theory proves the karma to be definitely connected to kaal only, in a highly accurate manner. It's not the sun playing this role, only time acting upon them.

2) Tim Doucette: Quinan, Nova Scotia, Canada

Although he is legally blind (he has only 10% of the average vision during the day), he can see much more than an average person at night. As a teenager, he underwent an operation for his congenital cataracts, which removed his lenses and widened his pupils. As a result, his pupils now let in a lot of light which results in too bright and overexposed vision. But by night, he has tremendous vision and can pick out tiny subjects in the night sky which are invisible to others, making him a respected astronomer.

Here, kaal is not the only factor, but surely a prominent one in causing such peculiarities.

Bhav → Karma ↑↓

Here bhav means life. It is basically classified into 4 types

Humans Animals Celestial beings Infernal beings Scriptures would be the only source for examples of this kind today, because the knowledge thriving beyond the senses is sheerly lacking.

Certain karmas find activation the moment the change of bhav occurs. Those karmas stay active till the continuity of that bhav, and later hold no guarantee for their continuation.

Avadhi and Vibhanga Gyan are qualities that are bound to get activated the moment a human or animal shifts to the life of a deva or naaraki.

Bhaav → Karma ↑↓

Bhaav just doesn't mean feelings but it also means features, characteristics, style and all other abstract qualities, including karma itself.

1) A Suspect: Wiltshire, England


48 Trailblazer


We can be much more than A prisoner of our and others' past

Tectonics

The word "religion", whether written or spoken, gives the reader or listener a concrete impression that the following is greatly related to spirituality, or is relevant to the soul.

Though this definition is somewhat rigid, it would not be wrong in general situations. At some unique events, however, it might stumble and fall. Because religion, too, can be scientific; it is not only attached to spiritualism.

Long ago, Jain texts did contain highly elaborate and explicit scientific matters. Today, they lack them. The credit for the lack of such profound

scientific concepts in Jain scriptures may go to a few staunch Islamic rulers, who burnt and stole numerous scriptures, and to our lack of awareness.

Let the bygone past be kept aside. But even in the present, many dreams, like that of a telephone or a camera, have not remained dreams, but have been materialized. A prominent factor in their invention can possibly be the accurate scientific laws still present even in the surviving Jain scriptures.

Now, coming down to the essentials. It's time to unfurl what the lord foretold as the cause of a natural calamity, which scientists, after years and loads of research, have almost identically concluded.

Earthquakes are natural phenomena which causes catastrophic disasters. Before we head forward to glance into the Jain texts pertaining to earthquakes, we will dive into the depths of the research put forth by the equally meticulous theories of scientists.

Tectonic Plates

The surface which we live on seems to be fixed, without the possibility of any kind of movements, but isn't truly so. In reality, it is composed of many huge slabs called tectonic plates. These tec-

tonic plates are made of the Earth's crust combined with the top layer of the mantle. It is quite like a jigsaw puzzle.

The current land is made up of seven or eight such large plates and dozens of other smaller plates. In all, there are about 38 tectonic plates spread throughout the surface of the earth, the largest of which is the Pacific plate. It is the only major plate that contains no land mass. These plates undergo slow but constant movement.

Movements in the Tectonic Plates and Earthquakes

Scientists aren't precisely aware of how these tectonic plates move, but assume them to shift around on top of currents in the mantle layer underneath. Presumably, these currents of molten rock move in steady loops, rising when an area is heated by processes at the center of the earth and then sinking down again when they are cooled near the surface. The movement of these magma currents cause the plates to shift around. The edges of these tectonic plates interact in different ways. The plates move apart, towards each other, or brush past each other. These movements are called convergent, divergent and transform, respectively. The occur-

rence of any of these movements can result in an earthquake.

Earthquakes

Earthquakes occur when vibrations are caused by the movements of tectonic plates along a fault line, a fracture existing in the earth's crust. As tectonic plates undergo movement these fault zones are created. At times, tension builds up along a fault and further movements can cause the release of energy in the form of seismic waves or vibrations that take place on the earth's crust. These vibrations ripple violently through the crust, causing an earthquake.

In conclusion, there are two prominent processes that cause earthquakes:

- 1. The current that flows from the mantle to the crust causing tectonic plates to abruptly shift.
- 2. The movements of the tectonic plates, causing a release of energy in the form of seismic shockwaves.

We have gone through all the minute factors, from a scientific perspective, that play a role in earthquakes.

These conclusions have been made by thorough research and that research has been

enhanced by the utilization of modern technology.

We now move forward to unseal these conclusions from certain texts of Jain scriptures. As mentioned before, we might not find detailed explanations or lengthy descriptions on earthquakes, but whatever little facts living in the texts are proving themselves to be exquisitely accurate.

- Sthaanaanga Adhyana III Uddesh-4 Sutra 200 and Commentary - Here 3 reasons have been mentioned for causing the land to move (earthquake) partially. The second and third reasons are caused by celestial beings but the first reason does quite fit the scientific conclusion we just saw.

The text says that, by the course of only nature, nothing apart from that, there are movements in the land. Chunks of land either crash together or break themselves free from one another and this movement of huge chunks causes the land to shake or tremble.

If you once again go through the scientific standpoint and make a comparative study you will immediately realize that of the three types of movements listed, two have been mentioned directly in these texts. The third type - plates sliding past each other (transform) - though not mentioned directly, can be quite simply inferred. We know that these texts don't possess much explanations, as a result of which, very obvious, unwritten concepts too have to be deduced.

There is another text from the exact same place as mentioned before.



Here the talk is about a great portion of land, or rather almost the whole land, trembling. Here too, only the first reason can be called a scientific cause and be compared with scientific research.

Deep beneath the superficial surface, lies a layer of air much denser than the usual air, called Ghanvaat. Just above this layer of dense air, is a layer of dense water called Ghanodadhi. Atop this layer of water is land, which we call Ratnaprabha Prithyi.

When there is turbulence in Ghanvaat, it causes disturbance within the Ghanodadhi. The vigorous perturbance in the Ghanodadhi consequently creates pressure, and hence makes the land tremble to a great extent. Again, this tremble or vigorous shaking of land is what we call an earthquake.



Once again, you will need to take a look above. Doing so, you will see that another prominent reason behind earthquakes is the current that is responsible for the shifting and trembling of the tectonic plates. Scientists have presumed the currents to cause the plates to tremble, but aren't absolutely confident about the fact.

On the other hand, years and years ago, God was aware of this fact without even a single bit of

research. He just worked on his soul and, as a result, was gifted with Kevalgyan; with the help of which, not a single fact was left unknown.

1) Valdivia, Chile, 22 May 1960 (magnitude 9.5)

This earthquake killed 1655 people, injured 3000 and displaced two million. It caused USD \$550 million worth of damages in Chile, while the tsunami that it spawned caused deaths and damage as far away as Hawaii, Japan and the Philippines. The 'rupture zone' of the quake was more than 1000 km long. Two days after the initial quake, the nearby volcano, Puyehue, erupted, sending ash and steam up to 6 km into the atmosphere over a period of several weeks.

2) Prince William Sound, Alaska, 28 March 1964 (mag. 9.2)

Compared to the Chilean earthquake, this earthquake was less damaging: the resulting tsunami took 128 lives and caused overall USD \$311 million in damages. The earthquake was felt mainly in Alaska as well as some places in Canada, while the tsunami created by it caused damage as far away as Hawaii. The most damage was sustained by the city of Anchorage, 120 km north-west of the epicenter. Shaking from the quake itself is reported to have

lasted for three minutes.

3) Sumatra, Indonesia, 26 December 2004 (mag. 9.1)

In terms of damage and loss of life, the scale of the disaster caused by the resulting Boxing Day Tsunami was enormous. In total, 227,900 people were killed or presumed dead, with around 1.7 million displaced over 14 countries in South Asia and East Africa. The epicenter was 250 km south-east of Band Aceh, Indonesia, at a depth of 30 km. Two days later on 28 December, a mud volcano began erupting near Bara tang, Andaman Islands, which is thought to have been associated with the earthquake.

4) Sendai, Japan, 11 March 2011 (mag. 9.0)

The Sendai earthquake is also known as the Great East Japan Earthquake. It triggered a massive tsunami that devastated coastal areas of northeastern Japan, causing widespread destruction. Approximately 16,000 people were killed, with thousands more injured or missing. In addition to

the human toll, the disaster led to a nuclear crisis at the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant, where reactor meltdowns released radioactive material, forcing evacuations and long-term environmental damage. The event remains a significant moment in Japan's history due to its profound human and environmental impacts.

5) Kamchatka, Russia, 4 November 1952 (mag. 9.0)

This earthquake generated a tsunami that caused widespread damage in the Hawaiian Islands. Property damage was estimated at around USD \$1,000,000. Some reports describe waves over 9m high at Kaena Point, Oahu. A farmer on Oahu reported the loss of six cows to the tsunami, but no people were reported killed.

6) Bio-bio, Chile, 27 February 2010 (mag. 8.8)

This earthquake and subsequent tsunami killed at least 521 people, with 56 missing and 12,000 injured. More than 800,000 people were displaced with a total of 1.8m people affected across Chile, where damage was estimated at USD

\$30 billion. The epicenter was 335 km south-west of Santiago, at a depth of 35 km. A minor tsunami traveled across the Pacific causing damage to boats as far away as San Diego, California.

7) Ecuador coast, 31 January 1906 (mag. 8.8)

This earthquake caused a tsunami that is reported to have killed between 500 and 1,500 in Ecuador and Colombia. The tsunami traveled as far north as San Francisco, on the west coast of the US, and west to Hawaii and Japan. The tsunami took roughly 12 hours to cross the Pacific to Hilo, Hawaii.

8) Rat Islands, Alaska, 2 April 1965(mag. 8.7)

The worst of the damage attributed to this earthquake was caused by a tsunami, reported to be about 10m high on Shemya Island. The wave caused flooding on Amchitka Island, causing USD \$10,000 in property damage. No deaths or injuries were reported.

9) Sumatra, Indonesia, 28 March 2005 (mag. 8.6)

This earthquake killed 1313, with over 400 people injured by the tsunami as far away as Sri Lanka. The epicenter was 205 km north-west of Sibolga, Sumatra, at a depth of 30 km. This region, also the site of the 2004 Boxing Day Tsunami, is particularly geologically active, with three of the 15 biggest known earthquakes having happened here.

10) Assam, Tibet, 15 August 1950 (mag. 8.6)

This inland earthquake caused widespread damages to buildings, as well as large landslides. 780 people were killed in eastern Tibet, with many villages and towns affected across Assam, China, Tibet and India. Oscillations to lake levels occurred as far away as Norway. The total death toll is likely to be higher, as no definitive total was ever estimated. While the earthquake itself is known as the Assam Earthquake, it is believed the epicenter may have been in Tibet.

Failures Who Never Failed

1) Isaac Newton

Isaac Newton did a lot of amazing things. He made rules about how things move and why stuff falls down. He built a cool telescope and figured out how fast sound travels. He even created a type of math called calculus. Plus, he fixed England's money troubles when he worked at the Royal Mint. But when he was young, things were tough. His mom made him quit school to be a farmer, but he hated it. He liked reading more than farming and often forgot his chores. Finally, he got back to school and later went to Trinity College, but he wasn't the best student. It wasn't until he had time to study on

his own that people saw how smart he really was. By 1669, his teacher was calling him a genius, and by 1670, he got a big job teaching math at a fancy university.

2) Abraham Lincoln

Abraham Lincoln tried his hand at various professions, including farming, soldiering, and even entrepreneurship, before entering politics. However, his early ventures were not particularly successful. Up until he was 21, he toiled on his family's farm. 3) The Wright Brothers

The Wright Brothers didn't get much attention at first, but when they showed they could fly, people started paying attention. People knew that birds could fly, and there were even hot-air balloons back in 1783. But making something heavier than air fly was tough. The Wright brothers started by trying to make better gliders, but many of their early attempts failed. Still, they kept going. They got interested in flying in the late 1890s, and by 1903, they flew a powered aircraft for 12 seconds, covering 37 meters, which is about the speed of jogging. That was a big deal, but not many people noticed. Local newspapers didn't think it was important, and some even thought the pictures of their longer flights were fake. It wasn't until 1908, when they did public demonstrations, that people really started giving them credit.

4) Walt Disney

Walt Disney's movies, including those made

by his studio after he passed away, are a big part of many people's childhoods. However, he faced many failures in his life. At one point, he was so broke that he supposedly had to eat dog food to survive. His first studio, the Laugh-O-Gram Studio, went bankrupt after just two years in 1923. His old boss said he lacked imagination and good ideas. In 1926, he made Oswald the Rabbit, which was successful, but he didn't own the character like he thought he did. When he asked for more money, his distributor said no and even cut his pay. He refused and lost most of his team. But losing Oswald turned out to be a good thing because it led him to create Mickey Mouse, who became way more famous.

5) JK Rowling

Harry Potter, one of the top five best-selling books of all time, was written while she was close to poverty. At the time, when JK Rowling was writing what was to become the most popular children's fiction series of all time, she was also at the lowest ebb of her life. Unemployed, she has described herself at that time as being as "poor as it is possible to be in modern Britain, without being homeless". She was a divorced, single mother of a

young child who was dependent on her and who she was raising alone, and she was struggling with clinical depression. When she first submitted the manuscript of Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone to publishing houses, no fewer than 12 of them rejected it. Even when Bloomsbury accepted the novel, Rowling was advised by her editor that she should get a day job, as she would not be able to earn enough from writing to support herself. You know the rest of the story. Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone became one of the top five bestselling books of all time, selling over 450 million copies in 79 languages. It and its sequels made Rowling the first person in the world to become a US dollar billionaire by writing fiction.

6) Bill Gates

The present success that Bill Gates did not come to him just like that. To reach this position, he had to travel long and thorny roads. At the age of 17, Gates had demonstrated the entrepreneurial spirit, forming a company

with his childhood friend, Paul Allen called Traf-o-Data. Their goal was to build a device that could read traffic counters but on the day of the reveal, the device failed to work. Even though their first project didn't work out, it taught Gates an invaluable lesson that he would carry forward with him. In 1973, Gates enrolled in Harvard University after scoring a near-perfect SAT score of 1590 out of 1600. However, he dropped out of Harvard the following year to start Microsoft with partner Paul Allen. A decision that proved to be the right one. It's cool to see how his early experiences led to his success.

7) Henry Ford

Henry Ford, born in Michigan in 1863, founded Ford Motor Company, one of the most profitable car companies globally. Despite his later successes, Ford faced many failures early on. At 28, he became an engineer, experimenting with gasoline engines. With mounting pressure, it was agreed that he would try again. But after disagreements, this venture also flopped. After initial failures, Henry Ford faced setbacks but finally succeeded in 1903 at the age of 40 when he founded Ford Motor Company with the support of Malcolmson. Despite previous failures, Ford's determination paid off. He revolutionized the automotive industry by creating affordable cars for everyday families, making the Ford name synonymous with automobiles. His innovations, like the assembly line, transformed the industry and made cars accessible to many.

8) Mark Zuckerberg

Mark Zuckerberg, the founder of Facebook, has indeed achieved remarkable success with his platform that has become one of the most widely used sites globally. However, students complained that the photos were being used without their consent, and it was later shut down by Harvard, forcing Zuckerberg to issue apologies and for the student paper to call the site "completely improper." However, his determination and vision have propelled him to become one of the wealthiest individuals globally, surpassing even his own expectations of success.

9) Steve Jobs

Steve Jobs, the late iconic billionaire, faced an enormous number of setbacks before achieving his legendary success with Apple Computers. 

Treachery and mimicry in our world is only to the extent of earning money, convincing your loved ones, and pulling one's leg to spend some moments of laughter and add some enjoyment to the atmosphere.

In the animal kingdom, Maya is executed for protection and in many following cases, for destruction as well. Used for whatever purpose, Maya at the end is Maya.

Time to unravel Maya's Exhibition in the world of animals

1) Brown Thornbill

It is a tiny Australian bird which uses mimicry for defense. When approached by would-be predators, it scares them off by its innate talent of mimicking sounds of other larger birds. It is also

capable of mimicking the sound of the pied currawong, which is about 40 times the size of the thornbill.

2) Sleeper Cichlid Fish

Here, the executed maya is for destruction. These fish are found in East Africa. They pretend to be dead by lying on their sides at the bottom of lakes. This way, by faking death, they naturally invite other fish close to them. When a scavenging fish approaches, the "corpse" suddenly jumps to life, snatches the investigating fish and makes it its meal.

3) Sabre-Toothed Blenny

This fish is also called the "False cleaner fish." It is known for mimicking the behaviour of cleaner wrasses, which remove parasites and dead skin from larger fish. The blenny copies the wrasse's shape, markings and movements to enable itself to get close to larger fish. The large fish, expecting it to be the cleaner fish, permits it to come close and then the blenny, instead of performing the expected cleaning procedure, it bites off a chunk of flesh and off it goes.

4) Bushveld Lizard

These Lizards belong to southern Africa. They are impeccable at mimicking the marking of oogpister beetles. The oogpister beetle is a fearsome insect that sprays formic acid at predators which at times causes blindness. This little black-and-white lizard has even learned to walk the same way as the beetle, which is a tactic used by it to keep predators at a safe distance.

5) Katydids

The katydids look like bright green tree leaves. These are little insects, but maya is in no way little in them. They use both attacking and defensive mimicry for their survival. They use their skills to imitate the female cicada's response to the male cicada mating call, luring unsuspecting male cicadas into becoming dinner. Their wise strategy is nothing but a clever production of maya.

6) Spider - Tailed Horned Viper

Their name itself gives a hint to the sharp minds. Their tails look much like a spider. Their skin too mimics the rocks of the terrain where these snakes live. Their use of maya is in the form of aggressive mimicry. The snake's tail has evolved to look like a spider and they use this characteristic in the form of maya. When there is a bird nearby, this snake hides its body among the rocks and moves its tail around to imitate the movement of a long spider. When the bird notices the "spider", it goes for the kill and just then, the prey and predator's roles are exchanged and the bird gets trapped in the illusion.

7) Thaumoctopus

It is also called the mimic octopus and belongs to the Indo-Pacific regions. Like other octopuses, it uses its chromatophores to disguise itself with the background. What makes it different from the rest of the octopuses is its ability of impersonating a wide variety of other marine animals. Divers have reportedly seen this illusionary creature imitating wilder species like jellyfish, giant crabs, feather stars, seahorses and many more. Scientists believe that the mimic octopus chooses which animal to impersonate based on which predator is hovering around.

8) Snapping Turtle

Despite having a powerful bite, these freshwater turtles disguise themselves among the dead wood and mud at the bottom of rivers and lakes, wiggling a small growth on their tongue within their open mouth. This growth mimics the movement and appearance of a worm. The turtle, proving itself a true fisherman, lies in wait until a fish becomes tempted by the bait and eventually turns into the turtle's dinner. In this example, it can be seen that this species' power is immense and there is seemingly no need for mimicry and maya. Still, the fact says it is being used.



Humans are no less in maya, but, if that continues, we humans might land ourselves into these violent forms of creatures, where maya has risen to become instinctual, where it fails to release its grasp. It is all up to us. Life is full of freedom and freshness when one trails on the path of honesty and saralta (simplicity). While in maya, the mind is forever flooded with the fear of being caught. 

The Attacks of 26/11 Mumbai

The highly infamous attacks on Mumbai on 26 November, 2008 generated a shocking tremor, whose vibrations didn't just stay concentrated in Mumbai, but flowed reluctantly all over India. Hostile terrorism gripped the nation for a very long time.

What all lacked within the Indian agencies that led to this attack is a different matter altogether. But the attack was the one, solely responsible for snatching close ones from the lives of innocent people.

All were unaware that the farewells they bid to their loved ones were going to turn out to be their last. The meeting in the morning was not just the last meeting of the day, but the last meeting of their lives. No one knew that their so-near and sodear ones, who were seen in the morning, would completely disappear by the evening of the very same day.

The people killed or injured were not the only victims who went through physical agony during these attacks. They obviously went through a harrowing ordeal for hours before being shot dead by the terrorists, but it was their family who had to carry the emotional trauma within their hearts for the rest of their lives.

This tragic incident labeled the victims with a tag - "Last Seen: 26/11/2008" – which, till date, generates an unsettled feeling within their family and friends. Let's try to empathize with what they might have gone through...

1) Mohammed Israel Ansari

This resident of Tardeo, Mumbai, was a simple taxi driver. On the night of Wednesday, 26/11/2008, he had driven his taxi to Chhatrapati Shivaji Terminus to drop off his ten-member-family to catch a train for Bihar.

He left his family at the station and went to the parking area when he heard sounds of shots being fired. Fear and immense worry clutched his heart. He ran straight into the station to locate his family and was shell-shocked after seeing the scenario. He found six of his family members dead and two with severe bullet wounds.

The terrible scene left him supremely shaken, but his eyes were still in search of someone close who was still missing. He could not locate his 17-year-old son, Murtaza. He had made many rounds of the JJ Hospital in search of his son, but success never approached him. He still does not have a clue about his son's life.

2) Janardan Chitekar

A migrant laborer and a native of Buldana, Maharashtra had called his children to Mumbai for the very first time. Little did their father know that this was not just their first trip to Mumbai, but also the very last trip of their life.

After their small Diwali vacation, Janardan left them at the Chhatrapati Shivaji station with their uncle. While he was leaving the station, deafening sounds of gunshots hit his ears. He rushed into the station but took time to find them. He first located his brother-in-law and enquired the whereabouts of his missing children.

Later he found his son's dead body lying on the St. George Hospital's floor but had no time to ponder over it or weep right then because his daughter was still unfound. Just one visit to Mumbai grabbed away Janardan's children, Deepali and Rajesh, from him for the rest of his life. Days went by but their memories never departed from dwelling in his broken heart till his last breath

3) Moshe Gavriel Holtzberg

Another site where the terrorists attacked was the Nariman House. This building, which houses Jewish families, was turned into a battleground with walls blown apart and windows shattered.

There lived a Jewish rabbi named Gavriel Holtzberg with his wife Rivka and nearly two-year-old son, Moshe. As the terrorists captured Nariman House, the rabbi and his wife, along with six other Jews including Moshe, were held as hostages. It surely might have been a terrifying situation for Rivka and Rabbi Holtzverg to see their two-year-old son as a captive of the ruthless terrorists.

Fortunately, two hostages were rescued, including Moshe. This certainly would have been a relief for their parents. Shnior Kup, a family friend of the rabbi, was constantly calling their cell phones

since he heard of their captivity. He took baby Moshe under his care after he was rescued.

After the end of Operation Black Tornada on Friday evening, 28/11, the bodies of Gavriel and Rivka were recovered from the building, along with three more dead hostages. God remains the only witness for the traumatic tortures that they surely would have endured.

Another fact that will ignite our emotions is that it was Moshe's second birthday on Saturday, the very next day after his parents' dead bodies were found. He couldn't have his parents even till his second birthday. This is all that an emotional Shnior Kup could manage to say, "He is crying for his mother. I don't know how to console him."

4) George Chatterjee

The Chatterjees had planned a new life in their hometown of Kolkata, but their plan was interrupted by a tragic twist in the tale.

George had retired three months earlier from his job at a courier firm in Goregaon. The family was to board the Geetanjali Express train at 6am on Thursday, 27/11. But fate demanded they arrive much earlier, because of what was soon to happen in their lives. George, with his mother, Meera, and wife, Shobha, reached the CST station twelve hours prior to their departure. That twelve-hour early arrival turned out to be lethal. After dropping off the two women, George went back to his residence in Nalasopara to collect the remaining luggage, which was considerable since they were leaving the city forever.

It was 9:50pm. While he was returning to the station, he became suspicious. George called his wife, but the call was not answered. After ten minutes, she did call back sounding terrified. Her words became increasingly unclear, shaken by fear. All that George could understand was, "Mother has been killed, they killed her".

This stunned George to the core, and he hurried to the station and then to St. George Hospital where his mother lay motionless, but generating piercing emotions in her son's heart. "I feel I have been deserted to face life on my own" were his only words after coming to terms with his mother's forever departure.

5) Meetu Asrani's Kin and Friends

45- year-old Lean, an American 'chat' buddy of Meetu Asrani, had visited India and met Meetu at

Leopold Café in the Taj Hotel. Meetu helped Lean plan her holiday, but was unaware that there was a long holiday being planned for herself.

She was one of the first victims of the terror attack at Leopold Café. Disastrous screams reverberated in the Asrani household at Sector 3 in Charkop.

One of her relatives later said that she was extremely creative and Balaji Telefilms had taken her on as a creative associate, a post she was yet to assume. She was on cloud nine and full of enthusiasm that she finally found the job she was looking for. Her dream was about to come true, but her eyes could not stay open and watch it happen in reality. All her dreams stepped out of the world, along with her.

One of her relatives, Kranti Gupta, said with a note of intense outrage, that they expect the government to take action to prevent such promising young lives to come to an end this way.

6) Khusboo Jha

The invitations were out, the caterer booked, the sweets distributed, the shopping all over. The wedding was to take place the very next week, but you know what happened next. 11th November, Wednesday, the phone rang late at night in Patna at the home of software engineer Khushboo Jha, giving her the news which left her in a state of disbelief and shock. She, in no way, could stem the overflow of tears.

Hundreds of kilometers south, in Mumbai, her fiancé, Malayesh Banarjee, a venture capital executive, was killed at the hands of terrorists as he dined with friends at Mumbai's Leopold Café.

Just 3 days ago, Khusboo's doctor father and lawyer mother had completed a pre-wedding ritual. The whole family overjoyed for the wedding, but who knew that it was to be short-lived, just like all other pleasures of this deceitful world.

Khushboo's next few days, months, or even years, need not be described. One can easily predict what she might have gone through after the news left her blank and numb.

7) Family of Gaurav Jain

On the night of 28/11, Friday, another coffin was brought to Indore, bearing the body of 27-year-old Gaurav Jain. His family just couldn't sustain that sight. It is impossible for a parent to bear the shock of such a tragic incident.

His death was sentimental. After dinner, he

was standing by the roadside, accompanied by two friends. His phone rang, and the last conversation with his beloved mother, Kanta Jain, began. He gladly got engaged in the conversation, sharing the events of that day spent with his friends. The sweet little mother-son conversation was brought to an end by the word "Bye Mummy". This simple farewell began to ring in his mother's ears like a final gift from her son, but only after this upcoming incident.

He disconnected the call with his mother and only minutes later, a police car, seized by the terrorists passed beside them. Unfortunately, Gaurav turned out to be one of the numerous victims of their open-firing, leaving him dead, with his blood gushing onto the roads of Mumbai.

"Bye Mummy! Ab phone rakhta hoon" still tears Kanta Jain's heart apart. Her son is no longer with her, only his memories to console her tear-filled eyes.

8) Family Of Laxmi Narayana Goel

A lawyer from Hyderabad, formerly the capital of Andhra Pradesh, was supposed to board his return train to Hyderabad, but that never happened.

He missed his train and informed his

family of that fact. He boarded a taxi to return to his sister's home. Within moments, the taxi exploded into a ball of fire after the grenades thrown by the terrorists detonated on it

He is survived by his wife and four daughters. His badly disfigured body was identified from the documents he had.



All gone forever from the lives of their family members, but not before leaving behind a cryptic message for the world to be solved.

They were someone's mother, someone's fiancé, and another's friend. They all had many dreams - the ones who left the world and the ones they left behind. All the dreams they saw ended just as dreams.

Many had monumental expectations of the departed person. Many were about to start a new life with that person. For many, he or she was their only support for the rest of their lives, their only backbone. All disappeared without the faintest clue of their departure. They not only departed, but even stole their dreams from them.

In these cases, it was these families who were victims. In the next case, it might be us - someone

from our family or our beloved leaving the world and spreading emptiness in our lives.
